What are the benefits of recycling?

Firstly, it helps CCA sustain the environment for future generations, and it reduces the need for production of using new or raw materials which means a reduction in air pollution, water pollution, and greenhouse gas emissions.

- Recycling saves energy
- Reduces the amount of waste being sent to landfill or incineration.
- Allows items to be useful for their entire life cycle instead of until they are no longer deemed aesthetically pleasing.
- Provides charities with the opportunity to stock free furniture

Last year 3200 items delivered/sold averaging 20kg an item = 64 Tonnes of furniture given a new home. 2390 Items collected/donated averaging 20kg an item = 48 Tonnes of furniture saved from landfill. 38 tonnes of clothes, bric-a-brac and books go to Choice Textile Ltd. Choice has a long held deep and passionate belief in both environmental issues and the massive importance of education. Hundreds and thousands of books are sent to schools. libraries and colleges in Africa. Choice is proud to say that less than 1% of what they collect ends up in landfill.
